
Allergies

The allergies module in the E-Chart allows you to keep track of a patient's drug allergies as well as other allergies (e.g. food, environmental, etc.).

Access a patient's allergies by clicking on the proper header on his/her E-Chart.




I. Adding a Drug Allergy




- 1. Type in the name of a drug and click Search.
 - Note: Partial queries will still return results (i.e. "penicil" will return "penicillin" results).
 - Note: Use the checkboxes to choose which drug categories to include.
- 2. A list of drugs will appear that match your query. Picking the most generic drug will allow OSCAR to detect as many drug interactions as possible for this patient.

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


3. Fill in the reaction information.

Note: "Start Date" and "Age of Onset" are not required.



Click Add Allergy. The drug will now appear on their allergy profile.
 Note: Severity of allergies is colour-coded. See the Legend above the profile.



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II. Adding a Custom Allergy


Custom allergies are used to track allergies that are not necessarily drugs (i.e. food, environmental, etc.).

1. Type in the name of the allergy in the Search box.



- 2. Click Custom Allergy.
- 3. Fill out the reaction information. See Section I. Adding a Drug Allergy, step 3.

III. Editing Existing Allergies



- 1. Click on "Inactivate" to remove an allergy. To view those allergies, click "Inactive" or "All".
- 2. Click on the notepad icon to add an annotation. The next time the icon is clicked, the annotation will appear.
